

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 4
TOWN OF COLLIERVILLE, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2020, I, Stan Joyner, Mayor of the Town of Collierville, Tennessee issued an Executive Order titled Resolution 2020-11 declaring a local State of Emergency for the Town of Collierville, and

WHEREAS, on March 23rd, 2020, I issued Executive Order Number 2-2020 Regarding Safer at Home Directive, and

WHEREAS, on March 30, 2020, I issued Executive Order No. 3-2020 declaring a State of Emergency continued to exist and extending the provisions of Order 2020-11 and Order No. 2-2020, and

WHEREAS, a State of Emergency continues to exist in the Town of Collierville and it is necessary to extend the State of Emergency and Resolution 2020-11, and Executive Order Number 2-2020, and


WHEREAS, on April 2, 2020, Tennessee Governor Bill Lee issued Executive Order No. 23 declaring that all persons in Tennessee are required to Stay At Home, except for when engaging in Essential Activities or Essential Services as defined in Executive Order No. 22, and

WHEREAS, in keeping with the Governor's Executive Order No. 23 all Collierville residents are required to Stay At Home except when engaging in Essential Activities or Essential Services as defined in Tennessee Governor's Executive Order No. 22

THEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED and DECLARED that Executive Order 2020-11 and Executive Order No. 2-2020 are extended as if set forth in full herein and shall remain in full force and effect until April 10, 2020. In the event of conflict or inconsistencies between the Governor's Orders and the Town of Collierville's Mayor's Orders, the more restrictive provision shall control.
